and I will heal their land - That's His promise.

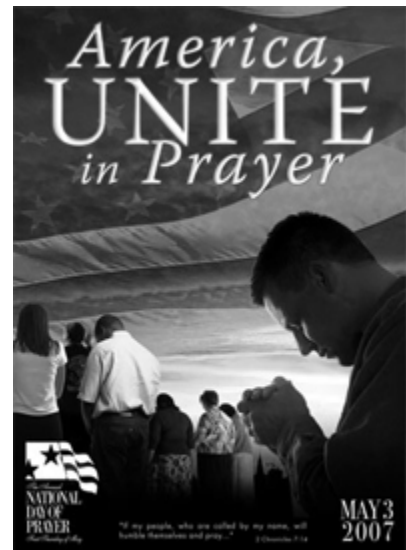
How will we respond?

Some Thoughts for Mother's Day - May 13, 2007

Proverbs 31:25 *"She (a wife of noble character) is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. 26 She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue.... 30 Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised."*

My mother and my wife always had something in common. They hated it when we made too much of Mother's Day. Mom considered herself to be a pretty normal person (as does my wife), and she wondered about the 24-hour pedestal she was put upon.

Here are a few sentiments that I have in my "Mother's Day" files that my mother never quite thought applied to her. *"A mother is God's deputy on earth."* Hmmm! I wonder what that means. How great is it that Moms get the rap of being on God's police force?

Here's another: *"An ounce of mother is worth a pound of clergy."* - A Spanish proverb according to my source. This may not be too flattering. Some people see clergy as the folks who make you feel guilty for the stuff you should have done but didn't and for the things you didn't do but should have. Mothers can be like that, but why mention it on Mother's Day?

Here's a sweet little poem I have in my files about Motherhood:

*Thank you, God,
For pretending not to notice that one of
Your angels is missing and for guiding her to me.
You must have known how much I would need her, so
You turned your head for a minute and allowed her to slip away to me.
Sometimes I wonder what special name you had for her.
I call her "Mother." By Bernice Maddux*

I'm not sure who Bernice is, but her perception of God seems to be that of an old man who enjoys the game of pretending to be unable to keep track of things – namely her mother. My Mom was more practical. Her God was a no-nonsense sort of "Ultimate Father" who didn't miss a trick and with whom one shouldn't mess.

In an old "Peanuts" cartoon, Lucy is seen looking into a hand-held mirror. Charlie Brown scolds, *"And besides! Never forget that beauty is only skin deep"*. Lucy protests: *"I deny that! My beauty is not only on the surface. It goes down deep ... layer after layer after layer!"* She returns to her mirror: *"Yes, sir!"* and finally *"I have very THICK beauty!"*

Cartoonist Shultz has given us a glimpse of the denial of our own sinfulness through his delightful character, Lucy. We pour cosmetics onto our bodies and think we are transforming our souls.

The book of Proverbs describes real beauty: *Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised* (31:30). It's not in our charm or in our outward appearances. It is a matter of the heart.



We haven't learned! According to "colipa.com", a web site showing marketing trends, the European cosmetic industry generates over 56 billion Euros on cosmetics, toiletries, and perfume. (A dollar is worth .82 Euros). The US consumption is just a trifle behind our lovely friends across the pond.

We spend billions of dollars making an attempt to make ourselves look good (men and women!) while countries in developing worlds around us suffer from the lack of the basic things like adequate nutrition, clean water, and health care. According to Scripture, such expenditures are all pretty deceptive and the results very fleeting.

So if you really want to "Wow the world" with who you are (and God would love you to do exactly that!), here's how: Clothe yourself with strength (of character) and dignity. Speak wisely and offer faithful instruction. Only then can it be truly said, "*My beauty is not only on the surface. It goes down deep ... layer after layer after layer!*"
